Be it enacted by the Cortland County Legislature in accordance with Local Law Number 2 for the year 1972 as follows:

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Article 1. Purpose: The purpose of this Local Law is to comply with the provisions of Local Law Number 2 for the year 1972 which directs that a commission be established by the County within six months of the publication of the regular federal census in Nineteen Hundred Eighty, and upon the publication of each ten year federal census thereafter, which shall examine the need for reapportioning the county legislative districts in terms of equity and representation. Said committee shall report to the Legislature in the form of a proposed Local Law within three months of its establishment.

This Local Law sets forth revised Legislative districts which have been developed with the conformity of the "one man - one vote" concept as its objective, and a weighted voting plan has been developed on this basis.

This Local Law also renumbers present Legislative Districts to eliminate confusion within the City of Cortland.

Article 2. Renumbering of Legislative Districts: To eliminate some confusion in the City of Cortland the districts have been renumbered so that within the City of Cortland the Legislative District Number shall be the same as the Ward Number from which City Aldermen are elected, thereby eliminating some difficulty in dealing with these districts. The district changes are set forth below:

Article 3. Reapportionment of Districts: For the purposes of electing legislators Cortland County will be divided into nineteen (19) legislative districts the population of which shall be based on the Nineteen Hundred Eighty (1980) federal census. The territorial boundaries and population of these districts are as follows:

Districts: With the passage of this Local Law the districts from which legislators in Cortland County will be elected effective with the November 1983 election and their respective populations are as follows:

District #1 - (Formerly #12)

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE CITY OF CORTLAND LYING WITHIN THE FOLLOWING BOUNDARIES: Beginning at a point in the center line of Homer Avenue where said center line intersects with the northern boundary of the City of Cortland; thence southerly along the center line of Homer Avenue to the center line of Madison Street; thence westerly along the center line of Madison Street to a point where the center line of Madison Street is intersected by Dry Creek; thence southwestwardly along the center line of Dry Creek to the intersection of Dry Creek with the westerly boundary of the City of Cortland; thence northerly along the westerly boundary of the City of Cortland to the northwest corner of the City of Cortland; thence easterly along the northerly boundary of the City of Cortland to the point of beginning.

District #2 - (formerly #13)

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE CITY OF CORTLAND LYING WITHIN THE FOLLOWING BOUNDARIES: Beginning at a point on the center line of Homer Avenue where said center line intersects with the center line of Madison Street; thence westerly along the center line of Madison Street to the center line of Floral Avenue; thence southerly along the center line of Floral Avenue to the center line of Groton Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Groton Avenue to the center line of Stevenson Street; thence southerly along the center line of Stevenson Street to the center line of Clayton Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Clayton Avenue to the center line of Main Street; thence northerly along the center line of Main Street to the center line of North Main Street; thence northerly along the center line of North Main Street to the point where said center line intersects with Dry Creek; thence southeasterly along the center line of Dry Creek to the center line of Homer Avenue; thence southerly along the center line of Homer Avenue to the point of beginning.

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE CITY OF CORTLAND LYING WITHIN THE FOLLOWING BOUNDARIES: Beginning at a point where Dry Creek intersects with the westerly boundary of the City of Cortland; thence southerly along the westerly boundary of the City of Cortland to a point where said boundary intersects with a line parallel to the center line of Pashley Drive extended to the boundary of the City of Cortland; thence easterly along said line to the center line of Broadway; thence northeasterly from the center line of Broadway along the center line of Neubig Road to the center line of an extension of Water Street; thence southerly along said extension of Water Street to the center line of Sands Street; thence southeasterly along the center line of Sands Street to the center line of Tompkins Street;

thence northeasterly along the center line of Tompkins Street to the center line of Main Street; thence northerly along the center line of Main Street to the center line of Clayton Avenue; thence westerly along the center line of Clayton Avenue to the center line of Stevenson Street; thence northerly along the center line of Stevenson Street to the center line of Groton Avenue; thence westerly along the center line of Groton Avenue to the center line of Floral Avenue; thence northerly along the center line of Floral Avenue to the center line of Madison Street; thence westerly along the center line of Madison Street to the point where Dry Creek intersects said center line; thence southwesterly along the center line of Dry Creek to the point of beginning.

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE CITY OF CORTLAND LYING WITHIN THE FOLLOWING BOUNDARIES: Beginning at a point where the center line of Delaware Street intersects with the southerly boundary of the City of Cortland; thence northerly along the center line of Delaware Street to the center line of Squires Street; thence easterly along the center line of Squires Street to the center line of Duane Street; thence northerly along the center line of Duane Street to the center line of Tompkins Street; thence southwesterly along the center line of Tompkins Street to the center line of Sands Street; thence northwesterly along the center line of Sands Street to the center line of Water Street; thence northerly along an extension to the center line of Water Street to the center line of Neubig Road; thence southwesterly along the center line of Neubig Road to the intersection of the center lines of Neubig Road, Broadway and Pashley Drive; thence westerly along an extension of the center line of Pashley Drive to the westerly boundary of the City of Cortland; thence southerly along the westerly boundary of the City of Cortland to the southwest corner of the City of Cortland; thence easterly along the southern boundary of the City of Cortland; to the point of beginning.

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE CITY OF CORTLAND LYING WITHIN THE FOLLOWING BOUNDARIES: Beginning at a point in the center line of Delaware Street where said center line intersects the southerly boundary of the City of Cortland; thence northerly along the center line of Delaware Street to the center line of Squires Street; thence westerly along the center line of Squires Street to the center line of Duane Street; thence northerly along the center line of Duane Street to the center line of Tompkins Street; thence northeasterly along the center line of Tompkins Street to the center line of Main Street; thence southerly along the center line of Main Street to the intersection of the center line of Main Street with the Lehigh Valley Railroad tracks; thence easterly along said center line to the easterly boundary of the City of Cortland; thence southerly along the easterly boundary of the City of Cortland to the southeast corner of the City of Cortland; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the City of Cortland to the point of beginning.
